Professionalism, leadership and service is evidenced in the form of presentations at professional society meetings and symposia, and leadership in student professional activities including K-12 outreach.

While pursuing a Master's degree Laurel VandePutte worked as a research assistant on the "Evaluation of the SCATS Control System" project led by Dr. Utpal Dutta at the University of Detroit Mercy. Laurel was responsible for coordinating and leading a team of fifteen student traffic data collectors. Laurel and her team preformed a comparative analysis of SCATS versus a pre-timed system to evaluate improvement in traffic and fuel economy as a result of implementing a SCATS system. Additionally, Laurel presented project findings to professionals, including US DOT representatives.

After earning a Bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering in 2007 from the University of Detroit Mercy, Laurel continued at UDM and received her Master of Engineering in 2008. Upon graduation Laurel accepted employment with the Michigan based construction firm of Walbridge as a project coordinator. While on Co-op, Laurel worked for the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District in Chicago, IL and for Charles Pankow Builders in Honolulu, HI.
